Nominations for the Queen's Medal can only be made by MsRCVS or RVNs, **excluding current members of RCVS Council and VN Council, and close relatives (including spouses) of the nominee.** Nominees for the award must be MsRCVS, **also excluding current RCVS Council and VN Council members.** Supporting statements can be supplied by non-veterinary professionals.
